

BIOGRAPHY - Eduard Čehovin

Eduard Cehovin graduated in Graphic Communication and Typography in the Department of Graphic Design at the Faculty of Applied Arts, Belgrade, Serbia.

He spent a year at Buffalo University and at the Parsons School of Design as a fellowship holder of the IREX – International Research and Exchanges Board, USA.

He has received more than 50 prestigious international awards such as: Type Directors Club Award, Art Directors Club Award, Good Design Award, Graphis Award, USA; D&AD, UK, etc. His works are published in all major international graphic design publications such as: Graphis, Communications Arts, Print, HOW, Visible Language, Typo Directors Club Annual, Art Directors Club Annual, USA; Linea Grafica, Italy; Novum, Germany; Etapes, France, etc. and have been exhibited in Australia, Canada, Europe, Japan, Taiwan and the USA.

He is a member of Friends of Icoграда – International Council of Graphic Design Associations; ADC – Art Directors Club New York, USA; D&AD, UK and a member of TDC – Type Directors Club New York, USA.

His works are included in the permanent design collections of the Chicago Athenaeum Museum, Merrill C. Berman Collection, USA; The International Trademark Center Collection, Belgium; Museum of Applied Arts, Serbia, Museum of Applied Arts, Croatia and Museum of Design (Poster Collection), Switzerland, etc.

He is a longstanding Art Director and Creative Director with the following agencies: Saatchi and Saatchi, Serbia; McCann-Erickson, Ogilvy&Mather JWT, Slovenia. Subsequently he opened his own studio, Design Center.

He is also a representative of ADC – Art Directors Club New York for the former Yugoslav Republic (Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Macedonia, Montenegro, Slovenia) and Austria.

He gives lectures and writes articles about graphic design and is also a member of several international design juries.

He teaches *Typography* and *Graphic Design* at the Department of Visual Communication, Academy of Fine Arts and Design, University of Ljubljana, Slovenia.
